Mungasaji Maharaj Mahavidyalaya, Darwha is one of the oldest Arts, Commerce and Science colleges of the Yavatmal District completing its 50th years of existence in 2020. The college is established in 1971 by late Balasaheb Ghuikhedkar a renowned Sahkarmaharshi and sociolist of his time. His schooling cannot be traced out and perhaps this might be the reason which grieved him too much and consequently motivated him to provide the higher education to the students of adjacent area, the education which he himself could not get and remained thirsty all through his life and kept on yearning in desire to gain it.

Mungasaji Maharaj Mahavidyalaya is located in Darwha which is a taluka place surrounded by the rural areas. The college is affiliated to Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati. The College is on the hill place of the town and Yavatmali- Darwha state highway passes right from its main gate. Its southwards Yavatmal district is situated while at its east, north and west, talukas named Ner, Digras, Karanja and Arni are respectively located. It deserves special mention that the area is known for belt of Cotton. The college falls in the category of coeducation (grant-in-aid) and every year in an average 2000 students are admitted for various academic courses. As far senior section of the college is concerned, almost 1500 students are accommodated in the various streams and programs offered by the college. To carry out all the functioning of the college, almost 75 teaching and non-teaching staff has been striving tirelessly since its establishment and the college has been continuously trying to ascend its progress graph having no feeling of satiety.



DRAFT REPORT ON INSTITUTIONAL ACCREDITATION OF MUNGASAJI MAHARAJ MAHAVIDYALAYA, DARWHA, DISTT, YAVATMAL (MAHARASHTRA)

SECTION 1: INTRODUCTION

Mungasaji Maharaj Mahavidyalaya, Darwha, Distt. Yavatmal, Maharashtra State affiliated to Amravati University was established in June 1971 and recognized by UGC under 2 f and 12 B in January 1987. It has a campus area of 07 acres in a rural sorroundings. The College was sponsored by Vidya Prasarak Mandal, Darwha. The college has mainly three faculties viz., Science, Arts and Commerce teaching under graduate courses in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics, in Science, English, Marathi, Persian, Pol. Science, Home Economics, History, Economics and Sociology in Arts, Accounts, and Statistics, Business Management Commerce Computer Applications, languages in Commerce. Besides Physical Education and Adult education, it offers 03 programme options in Science and 9 in Arts. There are 14 permanent faculty members, 7 temporary and 12 CHB teachers. There are 2 Technical staff and 10 Administrative staff. The college has a student strength of 619 out of which 317 are girls. The annual budget of the college is Rs 7000000 and unit cost of education is Rs. 11318/-The college gets grants in-aid from Govt. The temporal plan is annual system. The support services are Central Library, Computer lab. sports facilities, Hostel, Canteen, Welfare Schemes and Vehicle parking.

The Management of the college runs three more institutions namely Mungasaji Maharaj Jr. College, Darwha, Mungasaji Maharaj College of MCVC and Mungasaji Maharaj College of Physical Education, Darwha.

The College has volunteered to be assessed and accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council, (NAAC) and submitted its Self Study Report in the prescribed format to NAAC in 2003. The Peer Team of NAAC composed of Dr. P.K. Mishra, Former Vice-Chancellor, North Orissa University, (Chairman), Prof. A.K.Saxena, Former Principal, V.R.G. Govt.Girls P.G.College, Gwalior, (Member Co-ordinator) and Prof. P.V.V. Satyanarayana, Prof. of Chemistry, Nagarjuna University, (Member) visited the college on 14 – 15 January 2004. The Peer Team had useful interactions with the Management, Principal, Faculty, Students, Alumni, and Parents and visited different teaching departments and support services. The Peer Team has made a comprehensive assessment of the college and all its activities under the seven criteria laid down by NAAC and is pleased to submit the following report.

SECTION 2: CRITERION-WISE ANALYSIS

CRITERION 1: CURRICULAR ASPECTS.

The College is providing under graduate programmes in Arts Faculty (Pol Science/ Economics, Marathi Lit. / Home Economics, Sociology/ History and Urdu Lit./ Persian Lit.) in Science Faculty (Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics) and Commerce Faculty (with computer application as optional subject.) Being an affiliated college of Amravati University, the College has to follow syllabi decided by the University, and the college has no scope for any innovation at its level. However teachers of the college who are members of Boards of Studies of the University contribute to syllabi designing.

CRITERION 2: TEACHING, LEARNING AND EVALUATION

The students are admitted on the basis of their academic merit and personal interviews. The admission process is transparent. After admission the knowledge and skills in particular subjects are tested by the teacher concerned and change of subject / faculty is permitted within 15 days of the admission as per university rules. Remedial coaching scheme for SC/ST and educationally weaker sections was implemented with UGC assistance. Coaching classes in English for weaker sections and Backward minority communities and coaching classes for P.M.T. are also arranged. Advanced learners, and meritorious students are provided additional facilities. Teachers prepare annual teaching plan in advance. Teachers diaries are regularly maintained and scrutinized. Syllabi are unitized and teachers Class seminars are taken by some prepare topic wise synopsis. teachers. In addition to annual examinations conducted by the University, unit test, and terminal examinations are also conducted by the subject teachers. Lecture method of teaching is supplemented by class seminars and group discussions Video and audio cassettes on important topics are also used. Overall performance of students is monitored. Department address and reading own and relating sealout

Teachers are recruited by a selection committee as per university norms. Due to State Govt. ban on new recruitments, the college has not recruited any new regular teacher during the last two years and against vacant post temporary and clock hour basis teachers have been appointed.

The teacher's performance is evaluated by the Principal by using a format designed by the college. Feedback of the students is

also obtained. From 1978 to 2003 college has organized 5 University level/ State level seminars. Five teacher attended National Level symposium /Covention / Conference and one teacher got best teacher award. The College implemented COSSHIP (UGC) from 1978 to 2003.

CRITERION 3: RESEARCH, CONSULTANCY AND EXTENSION

Teachers are granted study leave for research, However, only one teacher availed this facility. Three teachers have published text books, five teachers have completed minor research projects of UGC and six teachers have submitted the proposals for minor research project.

The extension activities are community development, health and hygiene awareness, adult education, and literacy, blood donation camps and AIDS awareness etc. which are carried out by NSS with the collaboration of NGO'S and GO'S.

CRITERION 4: INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURSES

The total campus area is 7 acres. The college building has 21 class rooms Physics, Chemistry and Home Economics, laboratories, M.C.V.C, Department Library and reading room and administrative block. The college has used UGC developmental assistance and building grants, for augmenting its infrastructure. Women hostel, Library and some class rooms have been constructed by UGC grants. The building is properly maintained and is pollution free.

The College library is managed by the Library Committee and the Library staff consists of one Librarian and two attendents There are 20753 books in the library, in addition to 600 books in the Book Bank. 08 Journals/ Subject magazines are also subscribed.

Reprography facilities and audio video cassettes are also available. The college has 4 computers which have been purchased by UGC assistance. Physical Education Department provides facilities for in door-outdoor sports and Yoga. Facilities for Table Tennis, Basket ball, Foot Ball, Cricket, Kho-Kho and Volleyball, Running track are available in the college. Students are encouraged to participate in inter collegiate/Regional competitions.

Separate Hostel for Men and Women have been constructed by UGC assistance. However there are no admissions in women hostel.

CRITERION 5 : STUDENT'S SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION.

About 96% of the students appear for qualifying examination after minimum period of study, drop out rate is 4 to 5 %.

Alumni are reported to hold prominent positions in Business Politics, Teaching, C.A., Police and Legal departments One student has cleared NET and 4 have done Ph.D.

The College prospectus containing all the relevant information is published annually

The Scholarships/ Free ship of Govt. of India and State Govt., Merit / Handicapped scholarships, Scholarship from Vidharbha Shikshan Mandal Amravati and Maheshwari Pragati Mandal Mumbai are the various financial aids available to the students of the college and substantial number of students are benefitted. The college has constituted a Committee for providing Employment Guidance.

Recreational / Leisure time facilities available to the students are indoor/ outdoor games, audio visual facilities, cultural programmes, and dance/ music competitions.

CRITERION 6: ORGANISATION AND MANAGEMENT.

The college has an efficient internal coordination and monitoring system involving Local Management Committee, (LMC), Faculty-wise Vice Principals, Principal and the Staff Council. 36 Committees have been constituted for looking after different activities. The Principal, Vice-Principals and concerned committees check the work efficiency of non teaching staff. The college prepares annual academic calendar. The total annual budget of the colleges is Rs. 70,00,000. The budget deficit is met by LMC.

Welfare programmes of the college include Plant Adoption Scheme, Felicitation of meritorious students, Consumer Co-operative Society, Student insurance scheme, Hostel facilities, Memorial Prizes for students etc.

A Grievance Redressal Committee has been formed which mainly deals with the grievance of the employees. The college recommends the applications of the employees for Bank Loans and guarantees recovery of loan Instalments from their salaries.

CRITERION 7: HEALTHY PRACTICES

Some healthy practices are observed by the Peer Team. The college provides bridge course for weaker section of students. Coaching classes for weaker section and minority communities are organized in extra time. Intelligent and advanced learners are provided with library facilities. Teaching plans are prepared and teaching aids are used. The students are regularly assessed by internal tests.

Educational tours are organized. Students are intimated about their evaluation results. There is a Committee to monitor overall performance.

The college has its own mechanism for self appraisal of the teachers. Seminars and conferences are organised periodically. Some Teachers have received national awards. Study leave and loan are given to teachers for the Faculty improvement. The teachers undertake UGC funded minor research projects. Various extension activities are sponsored through the NSS in which students and teachers participate. The computer lab., sports, cultural activities youth festivals, exhibition, spiritual lecture programmes contribute to the allround development of students personalities. The cultural unit of the college has implemented Savitribai Fuley Adoption Scheme for the girls and also carried out Ghutkha Bandi and Tobacco Free Zones programmes. The college starts both the shifts with prayer.

SECTION 3: OVERALL ANALYSIS

Mungasaji Maharaj Mahavidyalaya, Darwha has completed 32 years of its existence and has been successful in its mission of providing educational facilities to students for backward rural area. There are some good features of college. Some such features are as follows:

- The College has 13 departments in the faculties of Arts,
 Commerce and Science.
- Subjects like Urdu Lit. and Persian Lit. are fairly popular amongst the minority community of the region.
- * The college has a big campus which if properly utilized may provide ample scope for its further development.

- Teaching work is well monitored. Lecture method of teaching is supplemented by seminars/ group discussions and some teachers also use audio visual teaching aids for making their teaching effective.
- Being an under graduate college teaching is the main activity but some teachers take interest in research, publish text books and research papers, undertake UGC minor research projects and attend academic conferences.
- Remedial classes are held for weaker students.
- Sufficient welfare facilities and free ships and scholarships are available for students.
- The college has made good use of UGC assistance.
- Rashtriya Geet Dhara, Savitribai Fuley Adoption Scheme for the girls below poverty line, Ghutkha Bandi and Tobacoo free zone programme, undertaken by the students deserve commendation.

The Peer Team would like to offer the following suggestions for further improvement in the functioning of the college.

Top priority may be accorded for improving the present status of Physics, Chemistry and Home Economics Laboratories. The laboratories may be adequately equipped and furnished.

Greater emphasis may be given to Faculty Improvement Scheme

The teachers may be further motivated / supported to engage themselves in active research.

More teachers should avail UGC assistance for minor research projects.

New vocational - job oriented courses may be started under self financing scheme.

Teaching - research collaboration / linkages may be established with the university and other reputed neighbouring colleges. This becomes all the more essential because in some departments the college has very young - less experienced temporary, CHB / part time faculty.

Efforts may be made at appropriate level to appoint regular faculty on vacant posts.

Library facilities may be further strengthened by adding more books / journals. Computerization of library may be given priority.

The College may consider to constitute the following.

- 1) Research Promotion Cell
- 2) Career Counselling and Guidance Cell.
- 3) Grievance Redressal Cell,
- 4) Alumni Association.
- 5) Parents council.

The college may set-up an Internal Quality Assurance Cell, as a follow up of various steps taken by it so far in the process of NAAC assessment and accreditation.

The Peer Team appreciates the initiative taken by the college to get itself assessed and accredited by NAAC. The Peer Team also wishes to record its appreciation for the whole hearted co-
